2017 Utah Archaeology Convention - Tours

All Day Tours

Participants will meet in the Uintah Conference Center Parking lot at 9:00 am and will drive themselves or carpool with other participants to the rock art sites. **Participants should bring their own lunch, snacks, and plenty of water.** Dress appropriately for hiking on uneven terrain for much of the day. We recommend bringing good footwear, hats, sunscreen, daypacks, cameras, etc.

Rainbow Park/McKee Springs rock art tour

Located on Dinosaur National Monument. Participants will drive or carpool approximately 20 miles on paved and dirt roads and hike several miles on uneven terrain. The tour will visit multiple panels.

Cockle Burr Wash rock art tour

The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Participants will drive or carpool approximately 20 miles on paved roads and hike several miles on uneven terrain. The tour will visit multiple panels.

Jones Hole Rock Art tour

Located on a stream flowing into the Green River. Participants will drive or carpool approximately 20 miles on paved roads and hike several miles on a dirt trail. The tour will visit multiple panels.

Cub Creek rock art tour

Located just south of Dinosaur National Monument. Participants will drive or carpool approximately 20 miles on paved and dirt roads and hike up and down very rugged/steep terrain.

Half Day Tours

Participants will meet in the Uintah Conference Center Parking lot at 1:00 pm and will drive themselves or carpool with other participants to the rock art sites. Dress appropriately for hiking on uneven terrain. We recommend bringing water, good footwear, hats, sunscreen, daypacks, cameras, etc. The Uintah Heritage Museum tour is the only handicap accessible tour.

McConkie Ranch rock art tour

The site is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. Participants will drive or carpool approximately 12 miles on paved roads and hike about 1 mile on dirt trails. The tour will visit multiple panels.

Ashley Creek rock art tour

Participants will drive or carpool approximately 12 miles on paved and dirt roads and hike up and down rugged and steep terrain. The tour will visit multiple panels.

Uintah County Heritage Museum

This tour is handicap accessible. Participants will walk or drive three city blocks to the Uintah County Heritage Museum where Museum staff will give a guided tour of artifacts and items related to the history and prehistory of the area. The Museum houses the Leo Thorne collection which is an amazing collection of Fremont period artifacts collected by Leo Thorne (a local photographer) in the early 1900s.
